To prevent vapor escaping to the atmosphere keep all containers closed or covered. The product should be stored in a separate room equipped for flammable liquid storage or small volumes may be stored in a flammable liquid cabinet. Eyewash stations are required in the workplace. If eye irritation is encountered the use of a full facepiece respirator is recommended. Mechanical ventilation is recommended in enclosed workspaces. Area should be evacuated of all non essential personnel prior to application of product.
